Some of our program offerings include:

It's Not Right! Neighbours, Friends & Families for Older Adults - This program is designed for families and friends of older adults who have concerns about their loved ones being mistreated.

See Something, Say Something! Reducing Risk for Older Adults - This program assists those who have regular contact with older or vulnerable adults help identify the warning signs of abuse.

The Decision Tree - This program is geared towards service providers and helps assist professionals in navigating the appropriate channels when responding to concerns about adult abuse and neglect.

Spotlight on Ageism - This program helps explain the prevalence and impacts of ageism (Canada's most tolerated form of discrimination!).

An Introduction to Extreme Clutter - This presentation explores why clutter/ hoarding happens, why it's important to address, and how it's linked to the prevalence of adult abuse, neglect, and self-neglect.
